- Avenue for industry consultation



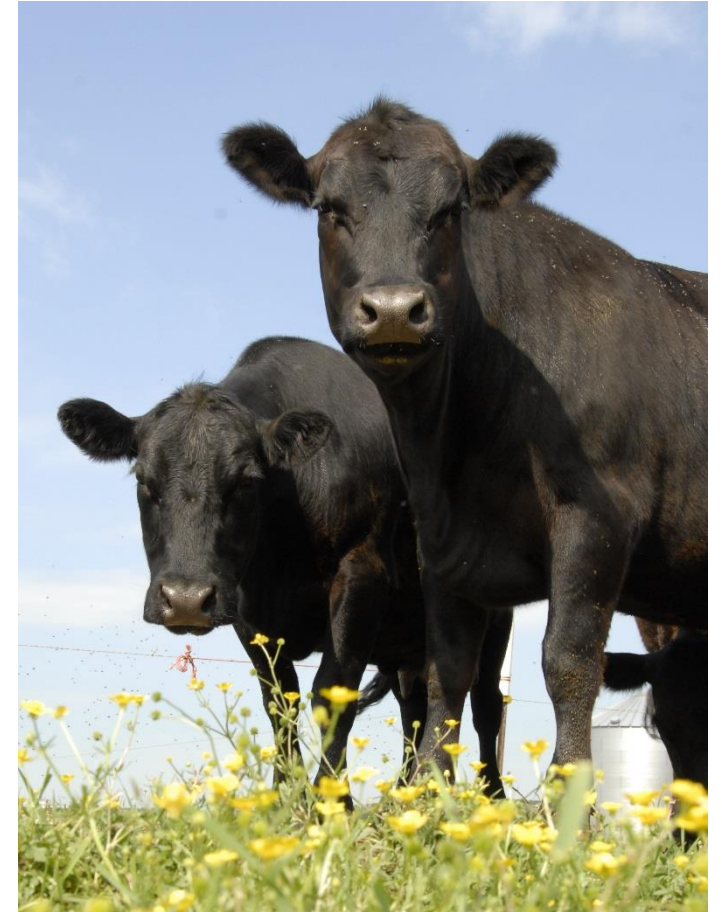
# Breeding Livestock Committee

- Joint Chair – LiveCorp and exporter
- Meet via teleconference and face-to-face as needed
- 7 meetings held last financial year

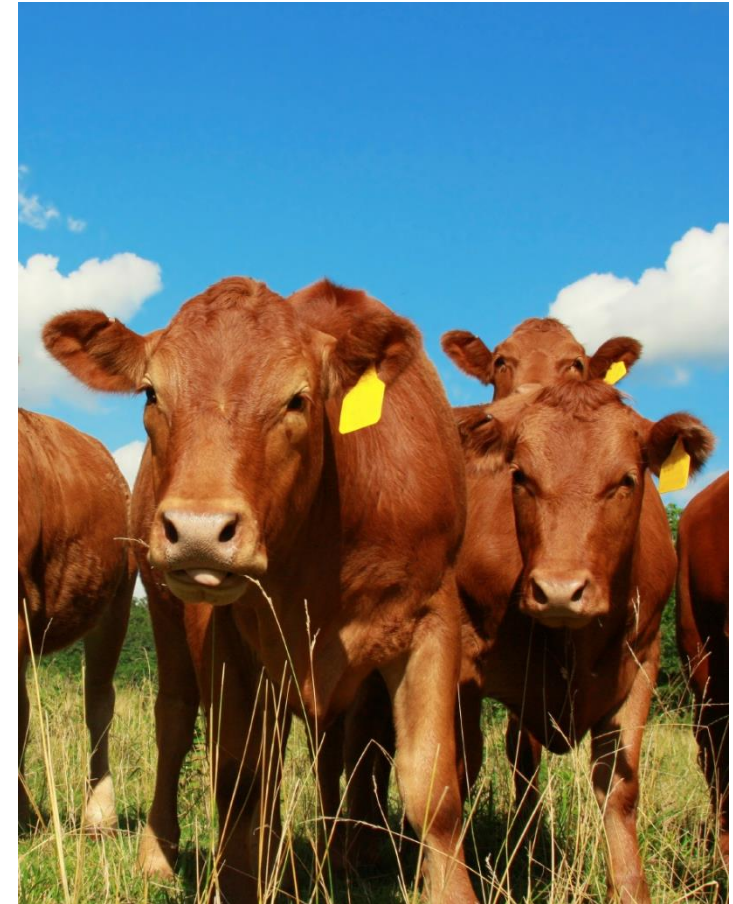
# Challenges

- Voluntary dairy export levy - financial constraints limit ability / efficiency of program to achieve outcomes
- Diversity of sector – not one size fits all



# Benefits

- Provides a basis for co-ordination of breeding livestock related issues rather than the previous ad-hoc approach.
- Has delivered a platform that has facilitated broader industry consultation with the Dairy Industry and Angus Australia to work through issues and share ideas.
- Established a process for how consultation and monitoring of work programs can be managed once the statutory levy is in place.
