
Stay standing if you have ever...

Round 2 - The High Seas


Stay standing if you have ever...

Done a voyage from a country other than Australia














Adi Tiawarman: Every vessel is different, so it's important to understand how to maintain steady livestock flow on each one you load.





Fi Bairds tip for the first few days: "Spread the cattle the best you can and tell the cook what food you DON'T eat, saves a lot of heartache on both sides".





Manage your crew and liaise with stevedores and exporters for an efficient discharge. It's a marathon not a race."












